in order to protect company s information assets such as sensitive customer records health care records etc the security practitioner first needs to find out what needs protected what risks those assets are exposed to what controls are in place to offset those risks and where to focus attention for risk treatment this is the true value and purpose of information security risk assessments effective risk assessments are meant to provide a defendable analysis of residual risk associated with your key assets so that risk treatment options can be explored information security risk assessment toolkit gives you the tools and skills to get a quick reliable and thorough risk assessment for key
