alexandrine grammarians his information he gathered mainly from oral sources as he traveled through asia minor down into egypt round the black sea and into various parts of greece and the neighboring countries the chronological narrative halts from time to time to give opportunity for descriptions of the country the people and their customs and previous history and the political account is constantly varied by rare tales and wonders among these descriptions of countries the most fascinating to the modern as it was to the ancient reader is his account of the marvels of the land of egypt
