socialism and to make it more effective as the ulbricht reformers put it these so called reforms are analyzed here at length illustrating how they did away with socialist principles and restored capitalist principles into the economy in a way that made the country prone to the chronic crises typical of capitalism this then led to a substantial part of the dissatisfied population turning away from socialism the socialist state and the sed ruling party and looking toward west germany for a better lifestyle in late 1989 the gdr imploded and within months it was swallowed up by west german banks and corporations
