maladaptive behaviors in institutional settings are a major cause of concern as well as are the aversive techniques that are applied in an attempt to manage them in an effort to eliminate maladaptive behaviors through the use of non aversive techniques a determination must be made as to the types of settings which may inhibit or contribute to behavioral outbursts it is necessary to test empirically as to whether or not these environments do produce a significant amount of the behaviors as the methods of treating them are controversial and the application of these methods many times present difficulties a proactive approach ruling out contextual antecedents could be beneficial in minimizing these incidents and may suggest the need for a possible change in environment based on incidents of maladaptive behavior the purpose of this study is to investigate the relationships between the amount of these incidents of maladaptive behavior as they appear within individuals of three different average developmental levels adl s and three different levels of environmental structure due to the difference in the amount of time that the subjects spent in each of the three environmental settings the time spent in two of the areas was prorated in an attempt in an attempt to make them comparable to the amount of time spent in the third environmental setting data was recorded by lakeland village staff completely independent of this study collection of this data simply required the transfer of it from the client unit record to the recording forms used in this study while there are many behaviors that may not be considered adaptive only those identified by the formal individual behavior program are recorded on a regular basis by the staff the subjects of this study consisted of sixty institutionalized mentally retarded adults living at lakeland village medical lake washington the three adl groups comprised the between subject component while the three environmental settings adult programs day training and the living unit comprised the within subject component the dependent variable is the number of incidents of maladaptive behavior for each subject with adl and environmental setting the independent variables the experimental hypothesis was that the amount of maladaptive behavior incidents in the context of adult programs or day training will be significantly greater than those on the living unit for the low adl group and that the amount of maladaptive behavior incidents in the context of adult programs or day training will be significantly lower than those on the living unit for the high adl group the null hypothesis was that the amount of maladaptive behavior incidents in the context of adult programs or day training will not be significantly greater than those on the living unit for the low adl group and that the amount of maladaptive behavior incidents in the context of adult programs or day training will not be significantly lower than those of the living unit for the high adl group maladaptive behavior incident scores were subjected to a 3 x 3 mixed analysis of variance comparisons among individual pairs of means were conducted following the analysis of variance using the lindquist critical difference procedure this multiple comparison technique which uses the error term from the analysis of variance guards against the inflation of error problem produced by repeated t tests analysis of variance failed to produce significant variances associated with either the three adl levels the three environmental settings or their interaction however in order to test the hypothesis involved it was necessary to conduct multiple comparisons among the adl level environmental setting means application of the critical difference figure indicated a number of significant differences primarily among the low and middle adl groups within the low adl group the

mean for the living unit was significantly smaller than the means for both adult programs and the living unit within the adult program setting the middle adl group mean significantly exceeded that for the high adl group within the day training setting the middle adl group mean significantly exceeded the means of both the low adl and the high adl group with that of the low adl group also significantly exceeding that of the high adl group within the living unit setting the middle adl group mean again significantly exceeded the means of both the low adl group and the high adl group it is apparent that this study supports the literature which points to the obvious heterogeneity of the mentally retarded population particularly as far as maladaptive behaviors are concerned and to the need to consider the environmental elements effecting them on an individual basis this is not a closed question and a more extensive study could be quite informative and meaningful if pursued document

abstract ample evidence suggests that young people with autism spectrum disorders asds present with a wide range of maladaptive behaviors beyond the core symptoms that define the disorder such maladaptive behaviors represent additional handicaps for these individuals and are associated with negative outcomes including poor social competency academic and vocational under achievement among others in spite of the prevalence and significance of maladaptive behaviors the natural course and predictors of such behaviors are not delineated in the asd literature this study was conducted to add to the scant body of knowledge on this topic participants were recruited using patient records at nisonger center clinics where potential participants were given an asd diagnosis two to eight years previously all individuals seen at the clinics had a measure of maladaptive behavior on file assessed using the nisonger child behavior rating form ncbf aman tassé rojahn hammer 1996 i conducted follow ups on 342 potential participants and collected follow up data from 143 41 8 of these individuals follow up data included current parent rated ncbf and supplementary demographic

information about the individual with an asd from families via a structured phone interview this information included a comorbid psychiatric diagnoses b current educational placement c current psychotropic medications and d interventions received results indicated substantial presence of maladaptive behaviors both at initial visit t1 and follow up t2 scores differed significantly between t1 and t2 assessments on all six ncbrf subscales indicating that maladaptive behaviors changed considerably with age scores on three of the six ncbrf subscales conduct hyperactivity and self injury stereotypic showed significant decline improvement over time while scores on the remaining three subscales insecure anxious self isolated ritualistic and overly sensitive increased deteriorated at follow up levels of maladaptive behaviors were found to vary considerably based on gender asd subtype and language abilities of participants as far as predictors of maladaptive behavior change the tested models accounted for 39 to 50 of the variance in t2 ncbrf subscale scores the t1 scores on the respective ncbrf subscales were the most consistent predictors of all six ncbrf subscale scores at follow up this indicates that a child s individual levels of maladaptive behavior at t1 were the best predictor of maladaptive behavior over time other variables that significantly predicted t2 scores on one or more ncbrf subscales included t1 age asd subtype and t1 language ability parents reported high rates 68 5 of comorbid psychiatric conditions in this community sample unselected for psychiatric disorders and also a high rate of psychotropic medication use 52 4 the most common comorbid disorders were anxiety disorders 37 8 and adhd 31 5 at follow up the highest proportion of participants were placed in developmentally handicapped classes 22 7 followed by regular classes with minimum accommodations 17 9 the vast majority 79 7 received at least one of the following interventions speech and language therapy occupational physical therapy or applied behavioral analytic therapy findings from this study add to the limited data on the natural course of maladaptive behavior in asds and have implications for clinicians parents and service providers in anticipating change over time and planning interventions

this study investigated the relationship between parent implemented interventions for autism and ratings of maladaptive behavior over a 6 month period of time participants were children between the ages of two and six years diagnosed with autism and their primary care providers repeated measures anovas and visual analysis of graphically represented mean scores were used to examine the differences between the parent reported ratings of maladaptive behaviors across two treatment groups consisting of an aba verbal behavior aba vb intervention model a relationship development intervention rdi model and a control or treatment as usual tau group across a 6 month enrollment period results indicated a lack of statistically significant findings however substantial effect sizes and changes in mean scoring indicating meaningful differences across groups and over assessment periods was found overall treatment groups were found to have greater reductions in maladaptive behaviors versus the treatment as usual group implications limitations and directions for future research are discussed

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
