distinctions since in fact we shall reject most of them in order to suggest entirely new ones it must be supposed that we shall do so by means of a criterion otherwise we should only be acting fantastically we should be saying peremptorily in my opinion this is mental and there would be no more ground for discussion than if the assertion were i prefer the romanticists to the classicists or i consider prose superior to poetry the criterion which i have employed and which i did not analyse until the unconscious use i had made of it revealed its existence to me is based on the two following rules 1 a rule of method the distinction between mind and matter must not only apply to the whole of the knowable but must be the deepest which can divide the knowable and must further be one of a permanent character a priori there is nothing to prove the existence of such a distinction it must be sought for and when found closely examined 2 an indication of the direction in which the search must be made taking into account the position already taken up by the majority of philosophers the manifestation of mind if it exists must be looked for in the domain of facts dealt with by psychology and the manifestation of matter in the domain explored by physicists i do not conceal from myself that there may be much that is arbitrary in my own criterion but this does not seem to me possible to avoid
