at the crossroads between international relations and anthropology the migrant passage analyzes how people from el salvador honduras and guatemala navigate the dangerous and uncertain clandestine journey across mexico to the united states however much advance planning they do they survive the journey through improvisation central american migrants improvise upon social roles and physical objects leveraging them for new purposes along the way over time the accumulation of individual journeys has cut a path across the socioeconomic and political landscape of mexico generating a social and material infrastructure that guides future passages and complicates borders tracing the survival strategies of migrants during the journey to the north the migrant passage shows how their mobility reshapes the social landscape of mexico and the book explores the implications for the future of sovereignty and the nation state to trace the continuous renewal of the transit corridor noelle brigden draws upon over two years of in depth multi sited ethnographic fieldwork along human smuggling routes from central america across mexico and into the united states in so doing she shows the value of disciplinary and methodological border crossing between international relations and anthropology to understand the relationships between human security international borders and clandestine transnationalism while the great war raged across the trench lined battlefields of europe a hidden conflict took place in the distant hinterlands of the turbulent mexican republic german officials and secret service operatives plotted to bring war to the united states through an array of schemes and strategies from training a german mexican army for a cross border invasion to dispatching saboteurs to disrupt american industry and planning for submarine bases on the western coast of mexico bill mills tells the true story of the most audacious of these operations the german plot to launch clandestine sea raiders from the mexican port of mazatlán to disrupt allied merchant shipping in the pacific the scheme led to a desperate struggle between german and american secret agents in mexico german consul fritz unger the director of a powerful trading house plotted to obtain a salvaged mexican gunboat to supply u boats operating off mexico and to seize a hapless tramp schooner to help hunt allied merchantmen unger s efforts were

opposed by a colorful array of individuals including a trusted member of the german secret service in mexico who was also the top american spy the u s state department s senior officer in mazatlán the hard charging commander of a navy gunboat and a draft dodging american informant in the enemy camp full of drama and intrigue treacherous passage is the first complete account of the daring german attempts to raid allied shipping from mexico in 1918 purchase the audio edition a sweeping account of three gujarati muslim trading communities whose commercial success over nearly two centuries sheds new light on the history of capitalism islam and empire in south asia during the nineteenth century three gujarati muslim commercial castes the bohras khojas and memons came to dominate muslim business in south asia although these communities constitute less than 1 percent of south asia s muslim population they are still disproportionately represented among the region s leading muslim owned firms today in no birds of passage michael o sullivan argues that the conditions enabling their success have never been understood thanks to stereotypes embraced equally by colonial administrators and muslim commentators that estrange them from their religious identity yet while long viewed as hindus in all but name or as westernized muslims who embraced colonial institutions these groups in fact entwined economic prerogatives and religious belief in a distinctive form of muslim capitalism following entrepreneurial firms from gujarat to the hijaz hong kong mombasa rangoon and beyond o sullivan reveals the importance of kinship networks private property and religious obligation to their business endeavors this paradigm of muslim capitalism found its highest expression in the jamaats the central caste institutions of each community which combined south asian islamicate and european traditions of corporate life the jamaats also played an essential role in negotiating the position of all three groups in relation to british authorities and indian muslim nationalists as well as the often sharp divisions within the castes themselves o sullivan s account sheds light on gujarati muslim economic life from the dawn of colonial hegemony in india to the crisis of the postcolonial state and provides fascinating insights into the broader effects of capitalist enterprise on muslim experience in modern south asia the many attempts by navigators to find a northwest passage via its pacific portal all ended in failure however their discoveries spurred expansionist developments that would forever alter the landscape of north america in discovering nothing david I

thinking creativity and interactive learning have been incorporated in the pedagogy that is embedded in the course content of the series on the 20th of january 1526 the santiago left lisbon bound for africa with a cargo of brass and tin bracelets round bells barber basins and cloth by early october the ship was back in portugal with a very different cargo 108 enslaved africans with chilling detachment the ship s trading log records the commodification of human beings the prices paid for them the sums received for their sale and the number who did not survive the crossing whilst this log may be extremely rare it is clear from another surviving document the receipt book of the customs office of the portuguese cape verde islands that such voyages were commonplace in the early years of the sixteenth century the bulk of this volume consists of a translation into english of the receipt book from the customs office of the cape verde islands in it portuguese customs agents recorded import duties on over 3 000 slaves transported from nearby west africa in 36 ships the customs officers named the slave traders ships officers crew and outfitters of the ships as well as the price of each slave and the import duty collected by the portuguese government and the catholic church a second section of the customs book provides details of export taxes paid on c 600 african slaves by merchants from portugal spain and the spanish canary islands when they exchanged european merchandise for slaves the final chapter of the volume translates the santiago s log providing an example of an actual slave trading expedition taken together these documents open a rare window into the workings and scope of the early atlantic slave trade bird migration between europe and africa is a fraught journey particularly in the mediterranean where migratory birds are shot and trapped in large numbers in malta thousands of hunters share a shrinking countryside they also rub shoulders with a strong bird protection and conservation lobby drawing on years of ethnographic fieldwork this book traces the complex interactions between hunters birds and the landscapes they inhabit as well as the dynamics and politics of bird conservation birds of passage looks at the practice and meaning of hunting in a specific context and raises broader questions about human wildlife interactions and the uncertain outcomes of conservation maryka omatsu s family was among those whose lives were shattered and properties taken by the canadian government s harsh and racist actions against japanese canadians during the second world war bittersweet passage is a moving account of the japanese canadian struggle to come to terms with a

faith we are often told by the cold light of science and reason to be modern was to reject the religious for the secular and rational in a bold retelling of philosophical history michael rosen explains the limits of this story showing that many modern and apparently secular ways of seeing the world were in fact profoundly shaped by religion the key thinkers rosen argues were the german idealists as they sought to reconcile reason and religion it was central to kant s philosophy that if god is both just and assigns us to heaven or hell for eternity we must know what is required of us and be able to choose freely in trying to live moral lives kant argued we are engaged in a collective enterprise as members of a church invisible working together to achieve justice in history as later idealists moved away from kant s ideas about personal immortality this idea of historical immortality took center stage through social projects that outlive us we maintain a kind of presence after death conceptions of historical immortality moved not just into the universalistic ideologies of liberalism and revolutionary socialism but into nationalist and racist doctrines that opposed them but how after global wars and genocide can we retain faith in any conception of shared moral progress and if not what is to become of the idea of historical immortality that is our present predicament a seamless blend of philosophy and intellectual history the shadow of god is a profound exploration of secular modernity s theistic inheritance from the 11th century ad east asian armies made increasing use of exploding missiles and siege cannon to reduce the fortifications of their enemies some of these weapons were very similar to those used in europe for example the heavy siege cannon used in the siege of p yongyang during the japanese invasion in the late 16th century others like the korean hwach a carts mounting over a hundred rockets that were used to bombard the japanese at haengiu in 1593 were very different from their european contemporaries this book details the design and use of the wide range of weaponry available during this period through time people have lived with darkness archaeology shows us that over the whole human journey people have sought out dark places for burials for votive deposition and sometimes for retreat or religious ritual away from the wider community thirteen papers explore palaeolithic use of deep caves in europe and the orientation of mortuary monuments in the neolithic and bronze age it examines how the senses are affected in caves and monuments that were used for ritual activities from bronze age miners in wales working in dangerous subterranean settings to
