the 1820s and 1830s were a crucial period in the historical experience of the british caribbean colonies because it marked the adoption of a policy of slaveemancipation by the british government central to the implementation of that policy was the formal embrace of the enslaved africans by the state church the anglican church this was made clear in the official pronouncement that religious instruction is the surest foundation for the amelioration of the state of the slave population facing the challenge of emancipation shows in clear and concise fashion how william hart coleridge the first anglican bishop of barbados and the leewards executed new mandate of the anglican church between 1824 and 1842 this inexperienced theologian displayed immense energy and skill in establishing his control over the diocese in neutralizing the entrenched opposition to reform and in raising financial support for a phenomenal building programme the result was that the anglican church for the first time became fully accessible to the enslaved and to their successors the so called apprentices and the newly freed persons particularly important was the provision of the rudiments of education both religious and secular to an increasing number of converts and their children through the agency of newly constructed chapels of ease and chapel schools goodridge demonstrates that by the time that bishop coleridge retired to england a flood of beneficial light had been cast on a dark period and that the anglican church in barbados could be said to possess a popular dimension

# The Life of the Right Rev. Jer. Taylor, D.D., Lord Bishop of Down, Connor, and Dromore 1832

benjamin hoadly 1676 1761 bishop successively of bangor hereford salisbury and winchester was the most controversial english churchman of the eighteenth century he has unjustly gained the reputation of a negligent and political bishop and with this publication gibson attempts to reappraise the legacy of this influential man it was hoadly s sermon on the nature of christ s kingdom that sparked the bangorian controversy which raged from 1717 to 1720 his sermons books and tracts poured from the press in huge quantities and were widely read by anglicans and dissenters alike yet his commitment to the ideology of the revolution of 1688 and to the comprehension of dissenters into the church of england earned him the antagonism of many contemporary and later churchmen this book is the first full length study of hoadly to be published and is a powerfully revisionist study hoadly emerges as a dedicated and conscientious bishop with strong and progressive principles he asserted the right of individuals to judge the bible for themselves without the shackles of ecclesiastical authority and sought to establish a liberal enclave in the church to re attract dissenters he also restored a strongly protestant commemorative view of the eucharist to the church but it was not simply his ecclesiastical work which made him such an important figure hoadly s stout defence of rationalism made him a founder of the english enlightenment his views on the nature of political authority also drew heavily on john locke and hoadly was responsible for bringing locke s views to a wide audience it was his commitment to civil liberties which made him a progenitor of the american revolution whilst his writing on the nature of civil authority was acclaimed by john adams as a source of american liberties and of the us constitution he also advanced sincerity of belief over the right of the state to impose penalties for the failure to conform in these principles he presaged the future direction of both religion and society

the prolific nineteenth century historian and liberal churchman george william cox 1827 1902 published this biography of the controversial bishop john william colenso 1814 83 in 1888 colenso was appointed the first bishop of natal in 1853 and in the next few years he oversaw the completion of the cathedral in pietermaritzburg and the building of churches in durban and richmond established mission stations and learned zulu he was heavily criticised for his tolerance of zulu practices and for his view that the old testament was not literally true eventually he was excommunicated though he retained a loyal following cox had accompanied colenso on his first visit to south africa in 1853 and remained a fervent supporter of the bishop s work eventually being nominated unsuccessfully as his successor volume 1 covers colenso s early years in cornwall his education at cambridge his appointment as bishop and the furore surrounding his theology

elizabeth bishop is now recognized as one of the greatest poets of the twentieth century a uniquely cosmopolitan writer with connections to the us canada brazil and also the uk given her neglected borrowings from many english authors and her strong influence on modern british verse yet the dominant biographical psychoanalytical approach leaves her style relatively untouched and it is vital that an increasing focus on archival material does not replace our attention to the writing itself bishop s verse is often compared with prose sometimes insultingly writing fiction she worried she was really writing poems but what truly is the difference between poetry and prose structurally conceptually historically speaking is prose simply formalized speech or does it have rhythms of its own ravinthiran seeks an answer to this question through close analysis of bishop s prose like verse her literary prose her prose poems and her letter prose this title is a provocation it demands that we reconsider the pejorative quality of the word prosaic playing on mosaic ravinthiran uses bishop s thinking about prose to approach for the first time her work in multiple genres as a stylistic whole elizabeth bishop s prosaic is concerned not only with her inimitable style but also larger questions to do with the anglo american shift from closed to open forms in the twentieth century this study identifies not just borrowings from but rich intertextual relationships with writers as diverse as among others gerard manley hopkins w h auden virginia woolf flannery o connor and dorothy richardson though bishop criticized woolf she in particular is treated as a central and thus far neglected precursor crucial to our understanding of bishop as a feminist poet finally the sustained discussion of how the history of prose frames effects of rhythm syntax and acoustic texture in both bishop s prose proper and her prosaic verse extends a body of research which seeks now to treat literature as a form of cognition technique and thought are finely wedded in bishop s work her literary forms evince a historical intelligence attuned to questions of power nationality tradition both literary and otherwise race and gender
