purposes and ideals the conviction without which we should not even attempt to attain them is faith and it is in faith and by faith that the man of religion proposes to conquer the world it is by faith in christianity that the missionary undertakes to convert men to christianity the comparative value of different religions can only be ascertained by comparison of those religions and the missionary of all men ought to know what is to be learnt from such comparison it is sometimes supposed wrongly that to admit that all religions are comparable is to admit that all are identical but in truth it is only because they differ that it is possible to compare them
