over the scottish covenanters at the battle of dunbar a victory that is often regarded as his finest hour but the aftermath the forced march of 5 000 prisoners from the battlefield to durham was one of the cruellest episodes in his career the march took them seven days without food and with little water no medical care the property of a ruthless regime determined to eradicate any possibility of further threat those who survived long enough to reach durham found no refuge only pestilence and despair exhausted starving and dreadfully weakened perhaps as many as 1 700 died from typhus and mounted with the accession of james vii of scotland james ii of england as a catholic king ruling over a predominantly presbyterian people it reached a climax in the outbreak of the highland war when viscount dundee won a devastating victory at killiecrankie on behalf of james vii

over the presbyterian forces of lowland scotland but at the cost of his own life subsequently the crown imposed an uneasy peace upon the highlands after the cold blooded plotting of murder under trust culminated in the glencoe massacre condoned by william of orange few events in the blood stained history of the highland clans have quite the dreadful resonance of this act carried out cynically as a 1643 all described as embodiments of england s national covenant also extended the boundaries of the political nation the poor and illiterate women as well as men all subscribed to these tests of loyalty which were presented as social contracts between the parliament and the people the solemn league and covenant in particular continued to provoke political controversy after 1649 and even into the 1690s many english presbyterians still viewed themselves as bound by its terms the author argues that these covenants had a significant and until now unrecognised influence on politics out of doors in the eighteenth century edward vallance is lecturer in early modern british history university of liverpool this is the first study of the interaction between warfare and national religious clan king and covenant explores the turbulent history of the highlands during the seventeenth century the signing of the national covenant in 1638 first challenged the powers of charles i in scotland but it was only when alisdair macdonald joined montrose in raising the royalist clans that the country erupted into civil war central to the conflict was the ancient enmity between the macdonalds and the campbells earls of argyll as clan donald attempted to reclaim their ancestral lands in argyll there followed a whirlwind year of spectacular victories for montrose in the name of the king as the highland clans emerged upon the national stage before his campaign subsided into eventual defeat however it was only after the restoration of charles ii that a bitter and protracted struggle broke out between church and crown after bishops were reappointed to the national church political and religious tensions mounted with the acession of james vii of scotland james ii of england as a catholic king ruling over a predominantly presbyterian people it reached a climax in the outbreak of the highland war when viscount dundee won a devastating victory at killiecrankie on behalf of james vii over the presbyterian forces of lowland scotland but at the cost of his own life subsequently the crown imposed an uneasy peace upon the highlands after the cold blooded plotting of murder under trust culminated in the glencoe massacre condoned by william of orange few events in the blood

stained history of the highland clans have quite the dreadful resonance of this act carried out cynically as a matter of public policy also available by the same author lost kingdoms and feuds forays and rebellions both edinburgh university press
