they might encounter while creating a story the author shows empathy with the characters expresses different emotions experienced by characters or overcomes a difficult situation that a character encountered this may help a child to express how they feel and understand how others feel storytelling is a way of self discovery and self expression their feelings can be demonstrated throughout the child s words creating a story can also develop language skills the mother tongue education is a raison d être for the schools because when learners develop their mother tongue they are simultaneously
