there is a profound crisis in the united states foster care system jill duerr berrick writes in this expertly researched passionately written book no state has passed the federally mandated child and family service review two thirds of the state systems have faced class action lawsuits demanding change and most tellingly well over half of all children who enter foster care never go home the field of child welfare has lost its way and is neglecting its fundamental responsibility to the most vulnerable children and families in america the family stories berrick weaves throughout the chapters provide a vivid backdrop for her statistics amanda raised in foster care began having children of her own while still a teen and lost them to the system when she became addicted to drugs tracy brought up by her schizophrenic single mother gave birth to the first of eight children at age fourteen and saw them all shuffled through foster care as she dealt drugs and went to prison both they and the other individuals that berrick features spent years without adequate support from social workers or the government before finally achieving a healthier life many people never do but despite the clear crisis in child welfare most calls for reform have focused on unproven prevention methods not on improving the situation for those already caught in the system berrick argues that real child welfare reform will only occur when the centerpiece of child welfare reunification permanency and foster care is reaffirmed take me home reminds us that children need long term caregivers who can help them develop and thrive when troubled parents can t change enough to permit reunification alternative permanency options must be pursued and no reform will matter for the hundreds of thousands of children entering foster care each year in america unless their experience of out of home care is considerably better than the one many now experience take me home offers prescriptions for policy change and strategies for parents social workers and judges struggling with permanency decisions readers will come away reinvigorated in their thinking about how to get children to the homes they need

unicef estimates that tanzania has over three million orphans the bethsaida orphan girls secondary school seeks to help the most vulnerable of tanzania s children founded by mrs anna machary in 2005 under the auspices of the non governmental organization the olof palme orphans education center the school currently enrolls over 130 orphan girls from all over the country providing them with free housing meals psychological support and a quality secondary education this book features short stories by thirteen students and has the dual purpose of being a fundraiser for the school and giving the girls a voice it is a unique and enthralling work of fiction their voices their stories ranges from magical realism to fable from historical fiction to bildungsroman under the professional and passionate editorial guidance of maryland professor julie wakeman linn this collection sings of the fears anxieties and dreams of young tanzanian women who pray their education will be the golden ticket out of lives filled with poverty and abuse

while many proponents of transracial adoption claim that american society is increasingly becoming color blind a growing body of research reveals that for transracial adoptees of all backgrounds racial identity does matter rhonda m roorda elaborates significantly on that finding specifically studying the effects of the adoption of black and biracial children by white parents she incorporates diverse perspectives on transracial adoption by concerned black americans of various ages including those who lived through jim crow and the civil rights era all her interviewees have been involved either personally or professionally in the lives of transracial adoptees and they offer strategies for navigating systemic racial inequalities while affirming the importance of black communities in the lives of transracial adoptive families in their voices is for parents child welfare providers social workers psychologists educators therapists and adoptees from all backgrounds who seek clarity about this phenomenon the author examines how social attitudes and federal policies concerning transracial adoption have changed over the last several decades she also includes suggestions on how to revise transracial adoption policy to better reflect the needs of transracial adoptive families perhaps most important in their voices is packed with advice for parents who are invested in nurturing a positive self image in their adopted children of color and the crucial perspectives those parents should consider when raising their children it offers adoptees of color encouragement in overcoming discrimination and explains why a race neutral environment maintained by so many white parents is not ideal for adoptees or their families
