of 14 million a year 5 844 on average for each woman diagnosed if screening coverage were to reach 100 per cent it estimates that costs to the nhs would almost half costs to the state would fall by a third and total costs to women diagnosed with cervical cancer would fall by around 40 per cent more importantly incidence of cancer would also almost halve based on these findings the report concludes by offering a set of recommendations for a renewed and concerted effort to increase the number of women regularly attending screening by removing some of the practical psychological and emotional barriers
